The Breaking of the Bread


The priest breaks the bread, saying



Fr Steven will be commissioned by Bishop Denise Ferguson during Mass on Wednesday 29 June, the Feast of St Peter and St Paul, at 7 pm.

Please remember in your prayers Fr Steven and Anne, and our parish community, as we prepare for this new season of ministry.

Fr Steven writes:

I am delighted to have received the Archbishop's invitation to be Parish Priest at St Mary Magdalene. I am grateful for the confidence shown in me by the Nomination committee. And I am looking forward to the Commissioning on 29 June. Above all, I consider it a privilege to be part of this compassionate faith community. So, let's do something wonderful together.

Fr Steven is a member of the **Australia & New Zealand Association of Theological Studies** and will be presenting two papers at the Association's annual conference in Sydney in the first week of July. Congratulations Fr Steven!

The theme of the conference in 2022 is "Future Theology". The aim of this conference theme is to provoke reflection on what future theology in its various disciplines might say and do, as well as what its future context might look like. While attempts to anticipate the future are inevitably speculative, the likely continuation of current trends and trajectories provides rich material for deliberation; indeed, thinking creatively about 'future theology' may even help generate and stimulate that future thinking itself.

A major emphasis for the conference is that theology—whatever its brave new world—might be not just a voice of caution, but a creative, constructive, and contributory voice, speaking hopefully into public discourse, the academy, and its ecclesial domains.

CORPUS CHRISTI IN 2022

For some years now the Parish has celebrated Corpus Christi – the Thanksgiving for the Sacrament of the Eucharist – on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, and extended an invitation to the priest and people from the wider Diocese to join us in celebration of this wonderful sacrament. The celebration has been necessarily low key in the past couple of years of the pandemic, and while we still have a Locum priest in post, it has been decided to transfer the celebration to next Sunday, 12 June. The Feast will also be celebrated on the Thursday and the 12.10 pm Mass.

ANOTHER EXPENSIVE WEEK ...

We have had yet another expensive week in the life of the Parish! The disabled toilet in the Mission Hall became blocked last week, and the plumber was duly called. The blockage was so substantial that the assistance of SA Water had to be enlisted! It was very time-consuming, and cost around \$800.

During the visit, which was the first time this toilet has required attention, we were advised that as this is formally described as a disabled toilet, there are regulatory standards which must be met as to the fixtures and fittings. We now have a new, up-to-code toilet – at a cost of \$2,000!

Also during the visit, the plumbers observed that the underground pipes, which are likely original to the building (1912) are in poor condition and require replacement. The cost is likely to be around \$8,000. Yet another item for the endless list of repairs and renovations!

MAY/JUNE STUDY COURSE: THE HISTORY AND MYSTERY OF ANGLICANISM
