Brothers and sisters:



# The Eucharistic Prayer



Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:







# The Breaking of the Bread


The priest breaks the bread, saying

# **Invitation to Communion**

#### COVID-19 - WHERE ARE WE NOW?

The dramatic increase in reported cases of COVID-19 in the community has been considered by the Parish Council, which has agreed that we will continue to take a conservative approach for the time being, and to encourage precautions including Distancing, Ventilation and Face masks: **DVM** for short. Distancing means maintaining a sensible distance of 1.5 metres between individuals or family groups; Ventilation means leaving some doors and/or windows open to allow a flow of air—and we have air conditioning, in case of extreme weather!—and Face masks are obvious.

#### SPECIAL SERVICES IN ADVENT






# **CHRISTMAS 2022**

#### WEEK 2: THE 1ST SUNDAY IN ADVENT

#### SAFETY IN EXILE – AND HOPE FOR THE FUTURE

Churches across Australia come together at Christmas to express unity in Christ through the Christmas Bowl. Since it was founded in 1949, the Christmas Bowl has brought together committed Australian Christians with dedicated local partners around the world, to give hope to people uprooted by conflict and disaster.

Today, on the 1st Sunday in Advent, the readings concern a basic Christian proclamation, that there is a new world coming. Sometimes it is called the eschaton or the parousia. Instead of the pain and injustice of this life, Jesus will return and there will be a new creation.

But for most Christians, there is little sense of urgency about the end of the world as we know it. We feel fine. But the early believers, including those who first received St Paul's letter to the Romans, which we hear today, anticipated the return of Christ very soon. They imagined a world set to rights, with God's justice for everyone. They weren't doing any long-range planning – they were just holding firm until their beloved Christ returned to establish a new kingdom.

They might be surprised that we are still waiting. In a relatively free and prosperous nation, while there might be the odd crisis or deadline, most of us don't live with a sense of urgency. But for people like those who are in exile in our own time—the tragedy of Ukraine brings this into stark relief—the need for divine justice is real and pressing. The Christmas Bowl supports the provision of food, medicine, warmth and security. In our time, these are so difficult to obtain, yet in God's future they will be freely available to all. We can't hasten the day of Jesus' return. But, if we believe in the world to come, we can start acting like it is here now. We can put aside our own petty desires and arguments, and put on the armour of light.
