THE ORDER OF COMPLINE

The Officiant begins

▶ The Lord Almighty grant us a quiet night and a perfect end.

R Amen.

Brethren: Be sober, be vigilant, because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour: whom resist, steadfast in the faith. But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us.

R Thanks be to God.

The Officiant then says

▼ O God, make speed to save us.

🧗 O Lord, make haste to help us.

V Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost:

R As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

V Praise ye the Lord.

R The Lord's Name be praised.

One or more of the following Psalms are sung or said.

Psalm 4 Cum invocarem

Antiphon: Have mercy upon me, O Lord, and hearken unto my prayer.

Hear me when I call, O God of my righteousness:*

thou hast set me at liberty when I was in trouble;

have mercy upon me, and hearken unto my prayer.

O ye sons of men, how long will ye blaspheme mine honour,* and have such pleasure in vanity, and seek after falsehood?

Know this also, that the Lord has chosen unto himself the man that is godly;* when I call upon the Lord he will hear me.

Stand in awe, and sin not;*

commune with your own heart, and in your chamber, and be still.

Offer the sacrifice of righteousness,*

and put your trust in the Lord.

There be many that say,*

Who will show us any good?

Therefore I beg blessed Mary ever-Virgin, blessed Michael the Archangel, blessed John the Baptist, the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, all the Saints, and you, my brethren, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

The Officiant says:

Almighty God have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins and bring us to everlasting life.

- R Amen.
- Wilt thou not turn again and quicken us, O God?
- R That thy people may rejoice in thee.
- V O Lord, show thy mercy upon us.
- R And grant us thy salvation.
- Vouchsafe, O Lord, to keep us this night without sin.
- R O Lord, have mercy upon us.

 O Lord, hear our prayer.
- R And let our cry come unto thee.
- V Let us pray.

Visit, we beseech thee, O Lord, this place: and drive far from it all snares of the enemy; let thy holy angels dwell herein to preserve us in peace, and let thy blessing be upon us evermore. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*

O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who at this evening hour didst rest in the sepulchre, and didst thereby sanctify the grave to be a bed of hope to thy people; make us so to abound in sorrow for our sins, which were the case of thy passion, that when our bodies lie in the dust, our souls may live with thee; who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, one God world without end. *Amen*

Look down, O Lord, from thy heavenly throne, illuminate the darkness of this night with thy celestial brightness, and from the sons of light banish the deeds of darkness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*

Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the silent hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and changes of this fleeting world, may repose upon thy eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*

Lighten our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord; and by the great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of thy only Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. *Amen*

Silence may be kept. Intercessions and thanksgivings may be offered.

- We will lay us down in peace and take our rest.
- R For it is thou, Lord, only that makest us dwell in safety.
- V The Lord be with you.
- R And with thy spirit.
- V Let us bless the Lord.
- R Thanks be to God.

The Officiant concludes

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. *Amen*

And the Anthem of the Blessed Virgin Mary appointed to the season may be sung, and at the end is said, May the divine assistance remain with us always. *Amen.*
