

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

Acts 12.1-11

Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

About that time King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword. After he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. (This was during the festival of Unleavened Bread.) When he had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover.

While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him.

The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, 'Get up quickly.' And the chains fell off his wrists.

The angel said to him, 'Fasten your belt and put on your sandals.' He did so. Then he said to him, 'Wrap your cloak around you and follow me.' Peter went out and followed him; he did not realize that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him.

Then Peter came to himself and said, 'Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.'

Peter turned and saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following them; he was the one who had reclined next to Jesus at the supper and had said, 'Lord, who is it that is going to betray you?' When Peter saw him, he said to Jesus, 'Lord, what about him?' Jesus said to him, 'If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you? Follow me!'

Sermon

Profession of Faith

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God eternally begotten of the Father God from God, Light from Light true God from true God begotten, not made of one Being with the Father. The Right Revd Denise Ferguson

Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life for the world to come. Amen.

THE COMMISSIONING FOR MINISTRY

The Presentation

The wardens, standing with the priest-designate, join together in saying

Bishop Denise, we welcome and present to you the Rev'd Dr Steven Ogden who has been chosen to serve as Parish Priest of St Mary Magdalene's. We believe that he is well qualified, and that he has been prayerfully and lawfully appointed.

The bishop addresses the priest-designate

Steven, my brother, I am now to induct you to this ministry and install you as Parish Priest of the Parish of St Mary Magdalene, Adelaide. You are called by God to work as pastor, priest and teacher. It is your task to proclaim by word and deed the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work. You are to preach, to declare God's reconciling love, to baptise, to preside at the celebration of the Lord's Supper and to encourage each one in their vocation and ministry. Do you, in the presence of this congregation, commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility?

Priest-designate I do.

The bishop invites the people to stand, addressing them in this way

Will you, who witness this new beginning, support and uphold Steven in this new ministry?

All We will.

The bishop says

Let us then offer our prayer to God for this congregation and for Steven.

The Venerable David Bassett leads the following prayer

God of gentle strength and unceasing care, we thank you for the Church in this place. Strengthen and sustain Steven that he may love and care for your people here. Grant that he may follow our Lord Jesus Christ, offering to you his gifts and talents, as he seeks to serve you in your world, through the same, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The congregation sits and the priest-designate moves forward to the Chancel steps. Symbols of ministry are brought forward, and all gather with the bishop and the priest-designate in view of the congregation.

The bishop says

All members of the Church are called by Christ to share in its ministry. As members of the body of Christ we each have distinctive gifts to offer. At his ordination Stephen received the call of Christ to priestly leadership among the People of God. Let us now celebrate the ministry of Priest and People together.

The archdeacon presides at the presentation of the symbols of ministry

Bible

Archdeacon Take this Bible. Always be faithful in reading, studying and meditating upon the word of God, diligent in proclaiming it and in encouraging the study of it.

Fr Steven I give thanks to God for this privilege and accept this ministry.

People We promise to hear, read and study the word of God.

Prayer Book

- Archdeacon This prayer book is a sign that you are among us as a person of prayer. Be faithful in ordering the worship of God's people, and in the life of prayer.
- Fr Steven I commit myself to this ministry, and thank God for it.

People We promise to give ourselves to God in prayer and worship.

Water

Archdeacon	Take this water. Be faithful in administering the sacrament of Baptism
	according to the command of Christ.
Fr Steven	I commit myself to this ministry, and thank God for it.

People We will welcome those baptised and assist them by our example and fellowship.

Bread and Wine

Archdeacon Take this bread and wine as a sign that you are among us as one who proclaims the death of Christ until he comes. Be faithful in presiding at the Lord's Table, that God's people may feed on Christ.

Fr Steven I commit myself to this ministry, and thank God for it.

People May God enable us to grow together as one body in Christ.

- Archdeacon Take this stole as a reminder to exercise your ordination commission to proclaim the Gospel of reconciliation.
- Fr Steven I give thanks to God for this privilege and seek his guidance in exercising this ministry.

People We recognise our need for forgiveness and seek grace to be reconciled to God.

Holy Oil

- Archdeacon Take this holy oil. Be among us as an instrument of God's healing love.
- Fr Steven I give thanks to God for this privilege and seek his guidance in exercising this ministry.

People We will pray for the sick and suffering and for those who need the healing power of God.

Basket of Food

- Archdeacon Take this basket of food. Remember our shared call to feed the hungry and care for the poor.
- Fr Steven I give thanks to God for this privilege and seek his guidance in exercising this ministry.
- People May God enable us to recognize and respond to the needs of all people.

The wardens say

Let us now affirm the call of Steven to serve as a Priest among us.

PeopleBe among us as a faithful priest and loving pastor
so that together we may proclaim the Good News of Christ
and with all God's faithful people obtain eternal life.

The Registrar, Mr Joe Thorpe, reads the Licence

The bishop gives Fr Steven the Licence, saying

Steven, receive this charge, which we share in Christ. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Installation

The bishop, standing with Fr Steven at the altar, says

My brother, I set you in your place among the people of this Parish. May you be faithful, as is the One who calls you.

Let us pray.

Set your seal, Lord, on all that we have done in your name. Grant both to this your servant, Steven, and to all these people, that they may fulfil in their lives what they have promised with their lips, to the glory of your Name and the well-being of your Church; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The bishop says

God pour upon you the abundance of his grace, and prosper all you do in his name; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

The bishop presents Fr Steven at the chancel steps

My brothers and sisters I present to you the Reverend Dr Steven Ogden, priest of the parish of St Mary Magdalene, Adelaide.

Fr Steven is greeted with applause

You have given us this earth to care for and delight in, and with its bounty you preserve our life.


We thank you that you bound yourself to the human race with the promises of a gracious covenant and called us to serve you in love and peace.



The Lord's Prayer


The bishop invites the people to join in the Lord's Prayer

The Breaking of the Bread and the Communion

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. We who are many are one body, **for we all share in the one bread.** The anthem Agnus Dei is sung



The bishop shows the Sacrament to the people, saying

Jesus is the Lamb of God

who takes away the sins of the world.

Happy are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,

But only say the word, and I shall be healed.

All receive Holy Communion. Communion will be administered in one kind only. Communicants should approach in single file, maintaining physical distance, returning via the side aisles.

Communicant members of all Christian churches are invited to join in receiving the Sacrament at this service.

During Communion, the choir sings anthems.
