
and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live

A reading from the letter to the Ephesians.

All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else. But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ – by grace you have been saved – and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God – not the result of works, so that no one may boast. 


We give you thanks and praise for your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, who by the power of your Spirit was born of Mary and lived as one of us.


Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

### The Breaking of the Bread


The priest breaks the bread, saying

#### **Invitation to Communion**

#### ANNUAL VESTRY MEETING

The Annual Vestry Meeting will be held on Sunday 21 March after the 10 am Mass. The business for the Annual Vestry Meeting is prescribed by ordinance, and includes receiving reports, the audited accounts, and the budget, and conducting elections.

There will be elections for the positions of Churchwarden (1), Parish Council (3 or a multiple of 3) and the Nomination Committee (3). Nomination forms are available and should be returned by Sunday 14 March. If you have any questions about serving in one of these ministries, please speak to either of the Wardens or Fr Gwilym.

The meeting will be chaired by the Archdeacon of the City of Adelaide and the Port, David Bassett, who will also preach at Mass on that day.

#### **WEEKDAY MASSES**

We have for the past 12 months offered Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays in addition to Sunday worship. Fr Gwilym's appointment necessitates a review of the Tuesday Mass, as he is not available on that day. There will therefore be **no Mass on Tuesday** for the next few weeks while we consider the options.

If you have a particular view or preference as regards weekday worship, please let Fr Gwilym or the Wardens know.

#### **WORSHIP IN HOLY WEEK AND EASTER**

Parish Council discussed at its last meeting the schedule of worship for Holy Week and Easter. The changes in the past year, and the ongoing impact of the pandemic on church attendance, mean that there are a number of matters to be considered.

**Palm Sunday**. On this day we gather at 10.30 am at St Francis Xavier's Cathedral Mass for an ecumenical Blessing and Procession of Palms before returning to the church for Mass. Please note the late starting time and the location. Those for whom the walk is too much can gather at the Church

On **Wednesday in Holy Week** we will offer the meditative service of **Tenebrae** at 7.30 pm.

On **Maundy Thursday** the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** will be offered at 7.30 pm. The traditional footwashing will not be observed this year, as the restrictions imposed by the pandemic continue. After Mass, the **Watch of the Passion** begins. We have for many years been able to maintain this vigil throughout the night until the liturgies of Good Friday. We will make a roster available in a few weeks time, on the basis of which we will make a decision about the length and format of the Watch.

On **Good Friday**, we have previously celebrated the special Liturgy of the Day in two ways, a morning service with a contemporary feel and music, and a 3 pm traditional celebration at which the St John Passion is sung. Both of these services have substantial regular congregations, a significant number of whom do not attend at other times of the year. We will maintain these two offerings at the times of 10 am and 3 pm.

On **Easter Sunday**, we have for around 20 years celebrated the **Easter Vigil** at dawn, followed by a gala breakfast. Parish Council has come to the conclusion that the declining numbers at this special celebration – it is the greatest celebration of the Church's year! – mean that the time of the Vigil needs to be reconsidered, with the options being

- Saturday evening at 8 or 9 pm;
- Sunday morning at 6 am.

We will again ask for a show of hands on these options, or you may reply by email. Rest assured that whatever the time, there will be a suitably festive celebration to follow!

Finally, the **Mass of Easter Day** will be at 10 am.
