
The 5th Sunday in Lent

Silence.

Let us then ask for mercy, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

Merciful God, our maker and our judge, we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, and in what we have failed to do: we have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves; we repent, and are sorry for all our sins. Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The priest says:

Almighty God, who has promised forgiveness to all who turn to him in faith: pardon ♥ you and set you free from all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Collect

Let us pray.

O God, our Redeemer, in our weakness we have failed to be your messengers of forgiveness and hope: renew us by your Holy Spirit, that we may follow your commands and proclaim your reign of love; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

Jeremiah 31.31-34

A reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah.

The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt – a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. But this is the

covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Second Reading

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

'You are my Son,

today I have begotten you';

as he says also in another place,

'You are a priest for ever,

according to the order of Melchizedek.'

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say – "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

Profession of Faith

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.



All glory and honour, be yours now and always, mighty Creator, everliving God.


We give you thanks and praise for your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, who by the power of your Spirit was born of Mary and lived as one of us.

Merciful God, we thank you for these gifts of your creation, this bread and wine, and we pray that by your Word and Holy Spirit, we who eat and drink them may be partakers of Christ's body and blood.

On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread; and when he had given you thanks he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take, eat. This is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'

After supper, he took the cup, and again giving thanks he gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Drink from this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded: proclaiming his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again, we celebrate, with this bread and this cup, his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world.



Let us proclaim the my-ste-ry of faith. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come a-gain.

Renew us by your Holy Spirit unite us in the body of your Son, and bring us with all your people into the joy of your eternal kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, we worship you, Father, in songs of never-ending praise:



Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil,


graciously grant peace in our days,

The Breaking of the Bread


The priest breaks the bread, saying

Invitation to Communion

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Come let us take this holy sacrament of the body and blood of Christ in remembrance that he died for us, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

All receive Holy Communion.

Communion will be administered in one kind only.

Communicants are asked to approach in single file, maintaining physical distance, returning to their places via the side aisles.

Those who are not to receive the Blessed Sacrament are invited to unite themselves with Jesus by making a Spiritual Communion.

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there, and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. ANNUAL VESTRY MEETING

The Annual Vestry Meeting will be held after the 10 am Mass today. There will be a short opportunity for hospitality after Mass, but please get your refreshments and be ready to begin the meeting without delay.

We welcome as our Preacher today the Venerable David Bassett, Archdeacon of the City of Adelaide and the Port (and our area Archdeacon). The Archdeacons advise and assist the Archbishop in the pastoral and administrative oversight of the diocese, and ensure the diocesan vision is implemented through the development of sound ministry strategies. The area archdeacons are responsible for offering care and advice to the clergy and the lay people who have been appointed to positions of leadership and responsibility and to take special responsibility to work with parishes in difficulties, or undergoing times of transition and change.

Archdeacon Bassett will also chair the Annual Vestry Meeting, which is his right as the Archbishop's representative. The Parish Council resolved that as Fr Graeme's appointment as Locum Priest concluded only a few weeks ago, and Fr Gwilym is just a few weeks into his appointment, it was a good opportunity to invite the Archdeacon to visit. This is particularly important given his central role in determining options for ministry in the parish in the short and medium term.

COVID-19 MISINFORMATION

The Archbishop has written to the Clergy to encourage them to distribute the Australian Government's Fact Sheet for the COVID Vaccine Rollout. Church leaders around the world have been speaking out amid warnings that misinformation and low uptake among some communities poses a risk to the programme's effectiveness in protecting the whole population.

WEEKDAY MASSES

We have for the past 12 months offered Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays in addition to Sunday worship. Fr Gwilym's appointment necessitates a review of the Tuesday Mass, as he is not available on that day. There will therefore be **no Mass on Tuesday** while we consider the options. If you have a particular view or preference as regards weekday worship, please let Fr Gwilym or the Wardens know.

WORSHIP IN HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

Parish Council has agreed on the following schedule of worship for Holy Week and Easter. The changes in the past year, and the ongoing impact of the pandemic on church attendance, mean that there are a number of variations in 2021.

Palm Sunday. On this day we gather at **10.30 am at St Francis Xavier's Cathedral** for an ecumenical Blessing and Procession of Palms before returning to the church for Mass. Please note the late starting time and the location. Those for whom the walk is too much can gather at the Church.

On Wednesday in Holy Week we will offer the meditative service of Tenebrae at 7.30 pm.

On **Maundy Thursday** the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** will be offered at **7.30 pm.** The traditional footwashing will not be observed this year, as the restrictions imposed by the pandemic continue.

After Mass on Maundy Thursday, the **Watch of the Passion** begins. We have for many years been able to maintain this vigil throughout the night until the liturgies of Good Friday. A roster is available: please consider nominating a time of at least an hour to keep watch: a decision about the length and format of the Watch will be advised next Sunday.

On **Good Friday**, we celebrate the special Liturgy of the Day in two ways, a morning service with a contemporary feel and music, and a 3 pm solemn celebration at which the St John Passion is sung. Both of these services have substantial regular congregations, a significant number of whom do not attend at other times of the year. We will maintain these two offerings at the times of **10 am and 3 pm**.

The **Easter Vigil** with the Lighting of the New Fire and Blessing of the Easter Candle; the Easter Proclamation and Liturgy of the Word; the Renewal of Baptismal Promises; and the First Mass of Easter will be celebrated at **8 pm on Saturday evening**. The Vigil will be followed by a cocktail reception.

Finally, the Mass of Easter Day will be at 10 am., and will also be followed by Easter Hospitality!
