PREPARATION FOR MASS

The priest and ministers having entered, facing the altar and standing before the lowest altar step, and the faithful kneeling, make the Sign of the Cross.

Priest: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Ministers: Amen.

Priest: I will go unto the altar of God.

Ministers: Even unto the God of my joy and gladness.

Psalm 43. Iudica me, Deus

Priest: Give sentence with me, O God, and defend my cause against the ungodly people : O deliver me from the deceitful and wicked man.

Ministers: For thou art the God of my strength, why hast thou put me from thee : and why go I so heavily, while the enemy oppresseth me?

Priest: O send out thy light and thy truth, that they may lead me : and bring me unto thy holy hill, and to thy dwelling.

Ministers: And that I may go unto the altar of God, even unto the God of my joy and gladness : and upon the harp will I give thanks unto thee, O God, my God.

Priest: Why art thou so heavy, O my soul : and why art thou so disquieted within me?

Ministers: O put thy trust in God, for I will yet give him thanks, Which is the help of my countenance, and my God.

Priest: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

Ministers: As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be : world without end. Amen.

Priest: I will go unto the altar of God.

Ministers: Even unto the God of my joy and gladness.

Priest: Our help is in the ✠ Name of the Lord.

Ministers: Who hath made heaven and earth.

With hands joined, bowing profoundly, the priest says:

Priest: I confess to Almighty God, to blessed Mary the Virgin, to blessed Michael the Archangel, to blessed John the Baptist, to the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, to all the Saints, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned exceedingly in thought, word, and deed, (striking the breast three times, the priest continues:) through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault. Therefore I beg blessed Mary the Virgin, blessed Michael the Archangel, blessed John Baptist, the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, all the Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Ministers: Almighty God have mercy upon thee, forgive thee thy sins, and bring thee to everlasting life.

Priest: Amen.

The priest the stands upright, and the Ministers repeat:

Ministers: I confess to Almighty God, to blessed Mary the Virgin, to blessed Michael the Archangel, to blessed John the Baptist, to the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, to all the Saints, and to thee, *Father*, that I have sinned exceedingly in thought, word, and deed, (all strike their breast three times, saying:) through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault. Therefore I beg blessed Mary the Virgin, blessed Michael the Archangel, blessed John Baptist, the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, all the Saints, and thee, *Father*, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Priest: Almighty God have mercy upon you, forgive you your sins and bring you to everlasting life.

Ministers: Amen.

Priest: May the Almighty and Merciful Lord grant unto us pardon, ✠ absolution and remission of all our sins.

Ministers: Amen.

Priest: Wilt thou not turn again and quicken us, O Lord?

Ministers: **That thy people may rejoice in thee.**

Priest: O Lord, show thy mercy upon us.

Ministers: **And grant us thy salvation.**

Priest: O Lord, hear my prayer.

Ministers: **And let my cry come unto thee.**

Priest: The Lord be with you.

Ministers: **And with thy spirit.**

Priest: Let us pray.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

EPISTLE

The Lesson from the Epistle of blessed James the Apostle.

Acts 1, 17-21.

Dearly beloved: Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning. Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures. Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow

to wrath: For the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God. Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

Ÿ. The Word of the Lord.

℞. **Thanks be to God.**

Alleluia, alleluia. **Ÿ. Ps. 118, 16.** The right hand of the Lord bringeth might things to pass: the right hand of the Lord hath exalted me. Alleluia. **Ÿ. Rom. 6, 5.** Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more: death hath no more dominion over him. Alleluia.

The continuation of the Holy Gospel according to John.

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: I go my way to him that sent me; and none of you asketh me, Whither goest thou? But because I have said these things unto you, sorrow hath filled your heart. Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send him unto you. And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: Of sin, because they believe not on me; Of righteousness, because I go to my Father, and ye see me no more; Of judgment, because the prince of this world is judged. I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now. Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come. He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew it unto you. All things that the Father hath are mine: therefore said I, that he shall take of mine, and shall shew it unto you.

R. Praise be to thee, O Christ.

A homily may be preached, or a pause for silent reflection observed.

THE INTERCESSION

(Form II)

The priest says

With all our heart and with all our mind, let us pray to the Lord, saying, "Lord, have mercy."
(or: Kyrie, eleison.)

The reader continues:

For the peace of the world, for the welfare of thy holy Church of God, and for the salvation of our souls, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

For Geoffrey, our Bishop, and for all Bishops, Priests, and Deacons, and all God's holy people, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

For *Elizabeth* our *Queen*, for the leaders of the nations, and for all in authority, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

For all children, born and unborn, for parents, and for all families, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

For seasonable weather, and for an abundance of the fruits of the earth, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

For deliverance from all danger and violence, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

For the aged and inform, for the widowed and orphans, and for the sick and the suffering, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

For the faithful departed of this parish, (for *N.*), and for all who have departed this life in the hope of the resurrection, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

That we may end our lives in faith and hope, without suffering and without reproach, let us pray to the Lord.

R. Lord, have mercy. (Kyrie, eleison.)

In the communion of the blessed Virgin Mary, of Saint Mary Magdalene, and of all the Saints, let us commend ourselves, and one another, and all our life, to Christ our God.

R. To thee, O Lord our God.

The priest concludes with this doxology,

For thine is thy majesty, O Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

OFFERTORY

The Lord be with you.
And with thy spirit.

Offertory. Ps. 66, 1-2 and 16. O be joyful in God, all ye lands, sing praises unto the honour of his name: O come hither and hearken, all ye that fear God, and I will tell you what the Lord hath done for my soul, alleluia.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

After the Priest has prepared the bread and wine for the Communion, the people are invited to enter spiritually into the celebration,

Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the Father almighty.

**The Lord receive the sacrifice at thy hands,
to the praise and glory of his name,
to our benefit, and that of all his holy Church.**

PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS

O God, who by communion in this venerable sacrifice hast made us partakers of the one supreme Godhead: grant, we beseech thee; that as we have the knowledge of thy truth, so by worthy conversation we may attain unto the fullness of the same; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

PREFACE

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God;

But chiefly are we bound to praise thee for the glorious Resurrection of thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord: for he is the very Paschal Lamb, which was offered for us, and hath taken away the sin of the world: who by his death hath destroyed death, and by his rising to life again hath restored to us everlasting life.

Therefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious name, evermore praising thee, and saying:

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts, Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high. ✠ Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

All glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou of thy tender mercy didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered) a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his Holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death until his coming again;

Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee, and with thy Holy and Life-giving Spirit vouchsafe to bless and sanctify both us and these thy gifts of Bread and Wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ, to the end that we, receiving the same, may be strengthened and refreshed both in body and soul;

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,

Take, eat, this is my Body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying,

Drink ye all of this;
for this is my Blood of the New Covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins;
Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy humble servants, having in remembrance the precious death and passion of thy dear Son, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, according to his holy institution, do celebrate, and set forth before thy Divine Majesty with these thy holy gifts, the memorial which he hath willed us to make, rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits which he hath procured unto us.

And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that all we, who are partakers of this holy Communion, may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction.

And although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service; not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences; Through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. **Amen.**

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Let us pray: As our Saviour Christ hath commanded and taught us, we are bold to say:

Our Father, which art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name: Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread: And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation. But deliver us from evil.

Deliver us, O Lord, we beseech thee, from all evils, past, present, and to come: and at the intercession of the blessed and glorious Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with thy blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and with Andrew, and all the Saints, favourably grant peace in our days: that by the help of thine availing mercy we may ever both be free from sin and safe from all distress.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

O LORD Jesus Christ, who saidst to thine Apostles, Peace I leave with you; my peace I give unto you: regard not our sins, but the faith of thy Christ; and grant to her peace and unity according to thy will; who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.**

The people may offer one another a sign of peace.

Taking the Host, the Priest says:

AGNUS DEI

Then the priest, bowing profoundly, says with all who shall receive Communion:

PRAYER OF HUMBLE ACCESS

WE do not presume to come to this thy Table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy Table. But thou art the same Lord whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his Blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his Body, and our souls washed through his most precious Blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him that taketh away the sins of the world.

**Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldst come under my roof:
but speak the word only and my soul shall be healed.**

The response is said three times, all striking their breast.

When the bell rings, all those who are to receive Holy Communion come forward. All communicant members of the Christian Church are invited to receive the Sacrament.

POSTCOMMUNION

Communion. John 16, 8. When the Comforter, the Spirit of truth is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment, alleluia, alleluia.

After Communion, silence may be kept.

Then the priest standing and the people kneeling, the priest says:

ALMIGHTY and everliving God, we most heartily thank thee, for that thou dost vouchsafe to feed us, who have duly received these holy mysteries, with the spiritual food of the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ; and dost assure us thereby of thy favour and goodness towards us; and that we are very members incorporate in the mystical body of thy Son, which is the blessed company of all faithful people; and are also heirs through hope of thy everlasting kingdom, by the merits of the most precious death and passion of thy dear Son. And we most humbly beseech thee, O heavenly Father, so to assist us with thy grace, that we may continue in that holy fellowship, and do all such good works as thou hast prepared for us to walk in; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honour and glory, world without end. **Amen.**

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Let us pray.

Assist us, mercifully, O Lord our God: that we, who have faithfully received this holy Sacrament, may thereby be cleansed from our iniquities, and delivered from all dangers that beset us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him: and without him was not any thing made that was made: in him was life, and the life was the light of men: and the light shineth in darkness, and the darkness comprehended it not. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the light, that all men through him might believe. He was not that light, but was sent to bear witness of that light. That was the true light that lighteth every man that cometh into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. **(genuflect)** And the Word was made flesh, **(rise)** and dwelt among us: and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the Only-begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.
